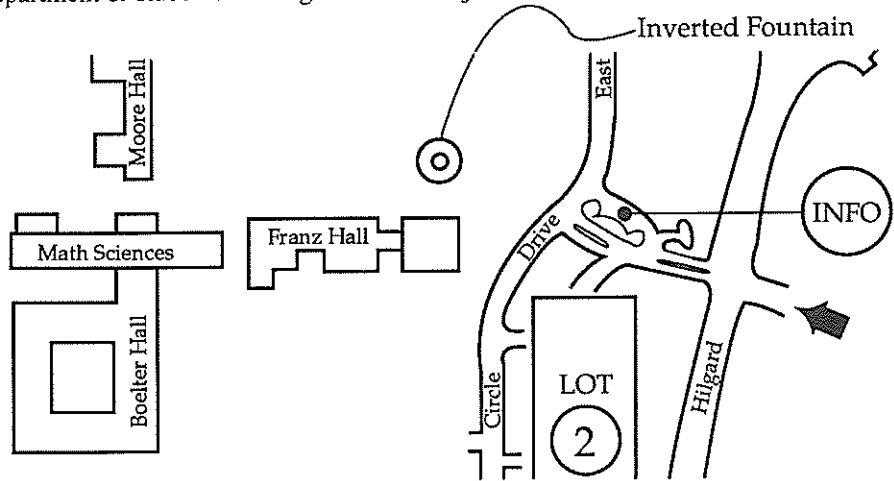

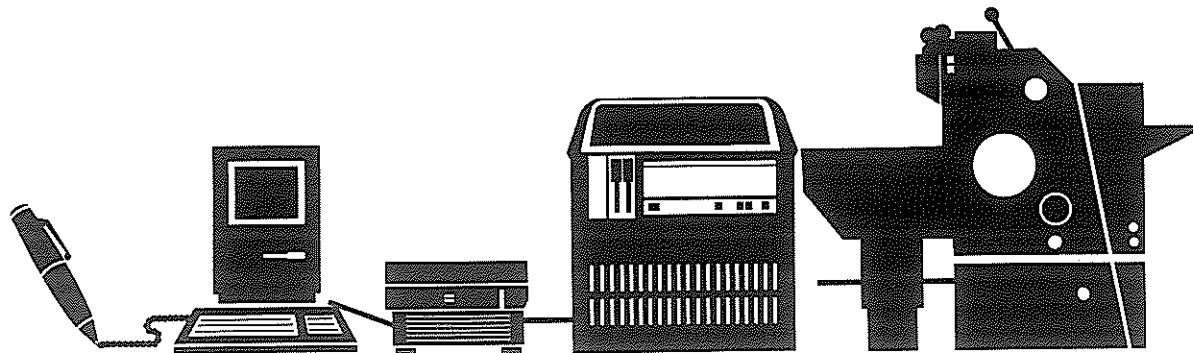

Those who are on wide area networks, such as ARPANET, Internet, SPAN and NSFnet, should take precautions against a computer virus which has already invaded JPL, Lawrence Livermore, NASA Ames, UC Berkeley, Stanford, MIT, Cornell, Purdue, University of Wisconsin, Boston University and the University of Chicago. It is rumored to have originated from a grad student at Cornell. The virus attacks UNIX computers, disabling the CPU by running a multitude of background processes which consume all available system resources. Software patches are available from most vendors to combat this menace.

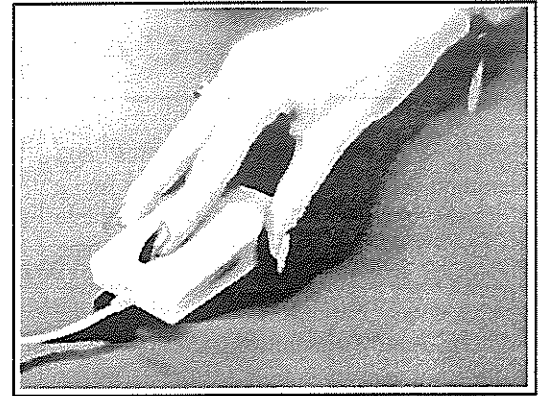
